Since 2009, Imagination Library has enriched the lives of children under five in Racine County by delivering a free book to their doorstep each month. The program reached a significant milestone in 2024, as the program celebrated its 10,000th graduate and proudly distributed over 500,000 books.

\$2 Million in State and Federal Refunds for Racine County Residents

United Way's VITA program provides free tax preparation and filing services for low-to moderate-income residents, including Spanish language options. This year the program was able to help more residents claim their refunds. In the 2023 tax season, over \$1.5 million in state and federal refunds were returned to the Racine County community through VITA.
