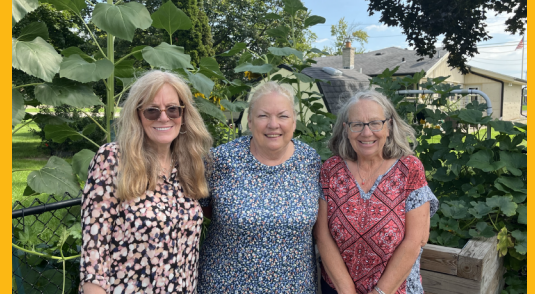


United Way of Racine County is building a thriving community by developing and investing in impactful programs that support more than 88,000 individuals across the county.

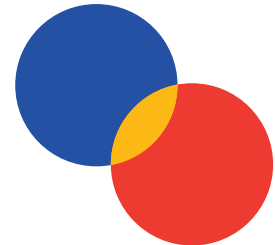

More Than a Meal

The Supper Club hosted by the Burlington Senior Activity Center is more than a meal. It is a place for older adults to connect, build friendships and feel part of a community. Each gathering features a homemade, five-course, nutritionally balanced meal, live entertainment and, most importantly, an opportunity to enjoy time together.

In 2026, the Center plans to host 10 Supper Club dinners. By the end of July, five dinners had already welcomed more than 280 seniors. And the impact is clear: 100% of survey participants say their Supper Club experience has positively affected their quality of life.

For many seniors, the Supper Club is their introduction to the Burlington Senior Activity Center. That first experience often leads them back for more through the Center's Connect & Thrive Program, where they can participate in activities that support their physical, mental and social well-being.

United Way of Racine County has proudly partnered with the Burlington Senior Activity Center since 2023. Three years of partnership have created countless opportunities for seniors to connect, thrive and feel a greater sense of belonging in their community.



Providing Relief When Families Need It Most

When a family faces an unexpected crisis, the right support at the right time can make all the difference. Love, Inc. provides immediate assistance to families across Western Racine County facing some of life's most difficult challenges.

Funding from United Way of Racine County helped Love, Inc. address three critical needs: providing healthy food options for people with dietary restrictions, offering emergency hotel stays for families experiencing homelessness and helping people at risk of eviction or utility disconnection remain safely in their homes.

Twelve families received emergency shelter through hotel stays, while eight families were able to remain in their homes with rental assistance. The funding also expanded access to food that met specific dietary needs, benefiting an average of more than 700 people each month.

For the families who received help, the funding offered more than immediate relief. It provided stability, dignity and the opportunity to move forward.
